

Restriction of Hazardous Substances (RoHS 3) EU RoHS directive 2015/863/EU Statement of Compliance



January 2026

Directive 2011/65/EU of the European Parliament and the Council of the European Union (RoHS Directive) restricts the use of certain hazardous substances in electrical & electronic equipment and came into force on January 1, 2013.

On 4th June 2015 the European Union published Directive (EU) 2015/863 ROHS3 which amends Annex II of Directive 2011/65/EU (ROHS) with regards to the list of restricted substances.

EU RoHS specifies maximum levels for the following 10 restricted substances. The first six applied to the original RoHS while the last four are added under RoHS3, from 22 July 2019.

- Cadmium (Cd): < 100 ppm
- Lead (Pb): < 1000 ppm
- Mercury (Hg): < 1000 ppm
- Hexavalent Chromium: (Cr VI) < 1000 ppm
- Polybrominated Biphenyls (PBB): < 1000 ppm
- Polybrominated Diphenyl Ethers (PBDE): < 1000 ppm
- Bis(2-Ethylhexyl) phthalate (DEHP): < 1000 ppm
- Benzyl butyl phthalate (BBP): < 1000 ppm
- Dibutyl phthalate (DBP): < 1000 ppm
- Diisobutyl phthalate (DIBP): < 1000 ppm
